DEFINE	What is the problem? Overuse of inhalers in patients with advanced pulmonary conditions	 Improvement opportunity & scope: Successful medication administration from metered-dose inhalers (MDIs), dry-powder inhalers (DPIs) or soft-mist inhalers (SMIs)(i.e., Respimat) are impacted by inspiratory effort and breath control Hospice patients lack the physical skill or cognitive ability to correctly use MDIs, DPIs and SMIs. In addition, these are costly therapies. 	Baseline monthly spend by hospice site Targeted Medication Report
2 _{MEASURE}	How are we doing? Gauge high utilization of inhalers and potential cost savings	Process to identify the problem and expected outcome • Measurable items: • Baseline monthly cost • Top hospice sites by charge • Most prescribed medications in targeted medication list • Top prescribers by charge • Goal: Defined as "X" % cost savings from baseline (i.e., 25%) • Outcome: Total monthly savings from baseline	Targeted Medication Report
3 ANALYZE	What is wrong? Identify actionable measures through assessment of current practices	 Root causes: Lack of patient assessment of inhaler use technique Lack of knowledge of appropriate use of inhalers vs. nebulizers in advanced pulmonary conditions Refilling medications without prior patient inhaler use assessment Patient/caregiver reluctance to change medications Others as defined by group 	Brainstorming Root cause analysis
4 IMPROVE	Fix the problem. Decrease utilization of inhalers and gain cost savings	Initiate the project, create project plan Select sites for project implementation Identify project lead Establish project timeline Select the drug class to target Introduce project during IDT discussions Staff training Patient/caregiver education	Targeted Medication Report Training video/slides Quick Facts for clinicians, "Use of Inhalers at End of Life" Patient/caregiver education
CONTROL	Maintain gains & publish results. Maintain current or lower level of utilization and costs of inhalers in overall spend	Control measures to maintain results; evaluate results; publish results • Monitor symptom outcomes • Monitor monthly utilization and cost trends • Evaluate changes in prescribing • Discuss progress and challenges during IDT meetings • Include in new hire training	Targeted Medication Report Patient records/ symptom assessment IDT agenda: Include as regular item for discussion
